Also note:

- Other courses may be approved on a case-by-case basis to fulfill some of these requirements
- A single course cannot satisfy more than one prerequisite; each prerequisite category above must be satisfied with a different course.
- A minimum of 60 credit hours must be completed before matriculation into GBCN.
- College courses are preferred over AP or CLEP credit; In-person courses are preferred over online.
- CLEP credit can fulfill an admission requirement, but not for lab sciences or for courses numbered 200-level or higher.
